RESEARCH CHAIR ON NEW CHALLENGES OF ECONOMIC GLOBALIZATION (NEME)

The Research Chair on New Challenges of Economic Globalization (NEME) is a partnership chair created with the support of the Ministry of International Relations and La Francophonie and the Ministry of Economy, Innovation and Energy of Quebec.

The Chair's mission is to conduct legal and multidisciplinary research and organize scientific activities with the aim of promoting the dissemination of knowledge on trade agreements and government policies. Its approach is multidisciplinary, and its ongoing collaboration with other disciplines is essential to study issues such as multilateral and regional governance of trade, the redefinition of global value chains, the impact of new free trade on agricultural sectors, the new governance of digital commerce, state intervention in economic recovery or development, the reconciliation of trade and environmental concerns, the fight against climate change, cybercrime, and international taxation issues, among others.
